

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH INFORMATION

Your neighborhood watch program is alive and well, with five block captains on board helping to provide an awareness of unusual or suspicious activities to the residents in their areas.

However this program only works as well as our residents understands what to look for. Later this year, with the support from the police department, we intend to coordinate an awareness orientation program for our residents who would like to learn more about keeping their neighborhood crime free.

Over the summer months we experienced a couple residential burglaries, both with small losses and we are still experiencing some theft of mail. Otherwise we enjoyed a quiet summer.

- As a reminder as of July 1st, the police department has initiated an on-line reporting system for some non-emergency crimes. The following activities are eligible for on-line reporting through www.pspd.com :
- Vandalism, (except graffiti)
- Thefts with no suspect information, (except burglaries)
- Vehicle tampering
- Lost or stolen property
- Harassing phone calls w/no suspect info

Residents are asked to report activity to the police, even though you may think its minor, it helps provide trends or patterns that can be very helpful to the police department.
